FAITH

The heart and soul of All Saints Catholic School is our Catholic foundation. Our school community is grounded in the tenets of our Catholic faith. Our school life is rooted in the Gospel message. A rich and highly developed prayer life draws us into a relationship with one another and, ultimately, with our Lord.

We begin and end each day praying together using a PA system that connects us. What a blessing it is to have the children, teachers and staff all joined together as one voice while listening to the individual prayer intentions that surface from our community and lifting those up to God.

- Each week, one of the pastors representing our 10 supporting parishes celebrates Mass. It is a joy for children to see their pastor celebrate Mass with us!
- Our Catholic formation continues into the classroom through our *Virtues in Practice* curriculum, religion lessons, service projects and more opportunities for prayer.

- Some of our pastors and deacons even teach in the classroom.
- We follow the Archdiocese of Milwaukee's grade-specific Catholic education curriculum to ensure every ASCS student has a well-rounded understanding of our faith. The curriculum is separated into four strands: historical and doctrinal foundations, moral life outlined in the Ten Commandments and the Beatitudes, liturgy and sacraments, scripture and life experience.
- While the reception of sacraments happens at each child's home parish, the sacramental preparation for First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion is done at ASCS.

Our Catholic faith is infused in everything we do. We pray together, play together and we celebrate the sacraments together. We are Catholic to the core—it's who we are and we wouldn't have it any other way!

VALUES

We are each made in the image and likeness of God. We start with this belief. To reach our fullest potential and become Christ-like, our approach is values-based. At ASCS, our values are rooted in the Gospel message of Jesus Christ. He is our first teacher of the values that we hold of highest importance. Forgiveness, humility, patience and charity are among those values we hold in high esteem—and ones we expect our students to learn and practice while they are here at ASCS.

These values not only help them navigate their day-to-day life at school, but help them beyond into home life, into sports, their family life, and the things they encounter in society. Our hope is that our value system can help our students reach their full potential—coming fully alive in Christ!

- Our *Virtues in Practice* curriculum focuses on one virtue per month. We establish a common definition of the virtue for all students, and then study a specific saint who exemplifies that virtue, creating a sense of common experience throughout the school while challenging each student's understanding and application.

- We offer five sports and over a dozen interest clubs such as theater, art club and forensics to give students opportunities to discover and explore their talents and gifts. Participants learn teamwork, sportsmanship and appreciation for each other's abilities and skills.
- With a strong focus on our Honor Code, we hold students accountable to a high standard of moral behavior inside and outside the classroom.
- We also help students make sense of what the Catholic teachings look like in their daily lives. Our students discover what it means to love their neighbor and be of service to them. We enjoy a rich tradition of serving in the community together through a variety of ways.

RIGOR

Rigor is synonymous with being Catholic. We look to Christ as the living and perfect example. The way of the cross, followed by His death and His resurrection led to freedom and human flourishing in incomprehensible ways.

At ASCS, Christ sets the standard for rigor. It's in our discipline—our expectations of our students to reach their highest potential; it's in our moral code—one that challenges students to make wise decisions inside and outside of school; it's in our academics—recognizing that each student has gifts to be manifested; and it's in our faith—knowing that it takes effort to form a friendship with Christ and through this friendship comes a thriving of every child. Rigor is God-centered knowing that all children deserve the best opportunity to blossom.

- Area high school teachers tell us they can often identify ASCS graduates by the quality of the work they submit. Our students tell us that they are often above par compared to their peers.
- Our early elementary curriculum establishes a strong reading and math foundation, while also a rigorous emphasis in all subjects.

- As students progress, our primary grades program expands on the foundation with the addition of longer research projects, group work and more autonomy over their learning process.
- The middle school curriculum centers on high school preparation. We increase the independence and self-direction of coursework to teach students important lifelong planning and organization skills in addition to our strong academic curriculum. Our standard math track is pre-Algebra in 7th grade and Algebra in 8th grade.
- Our award-winning writing, visual and performing arts program has produced dozens of published authors.

We hold our teaching staff to the same rigorous professional development. Our team of educators is expected to complete the Archdiocese's *Sustaining the Mission* religious education certification, as well as, keep up to date with pedagogical trends and techniques.

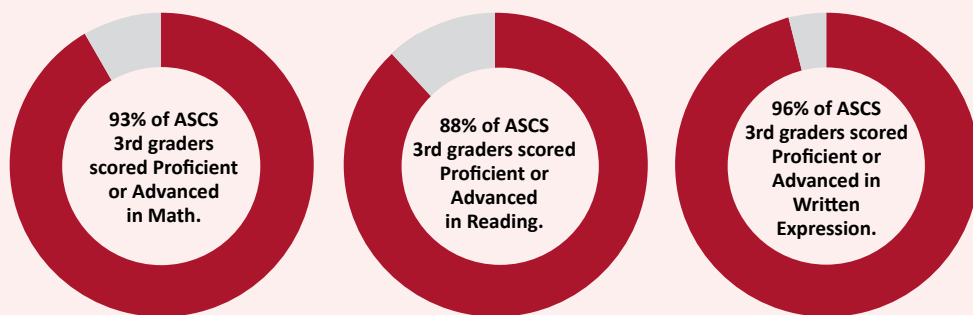


WHY ALL SAINTS?

2017–18 Iowa Standardized Test Results

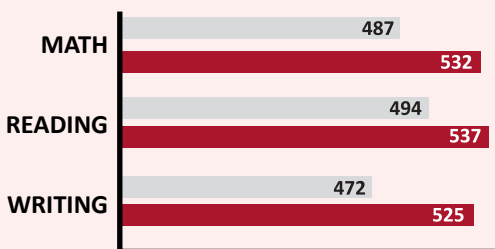


Religious school students score significantly higher on the SAT than their public school counterparts.

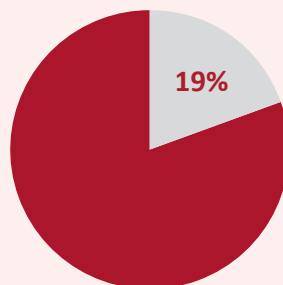
